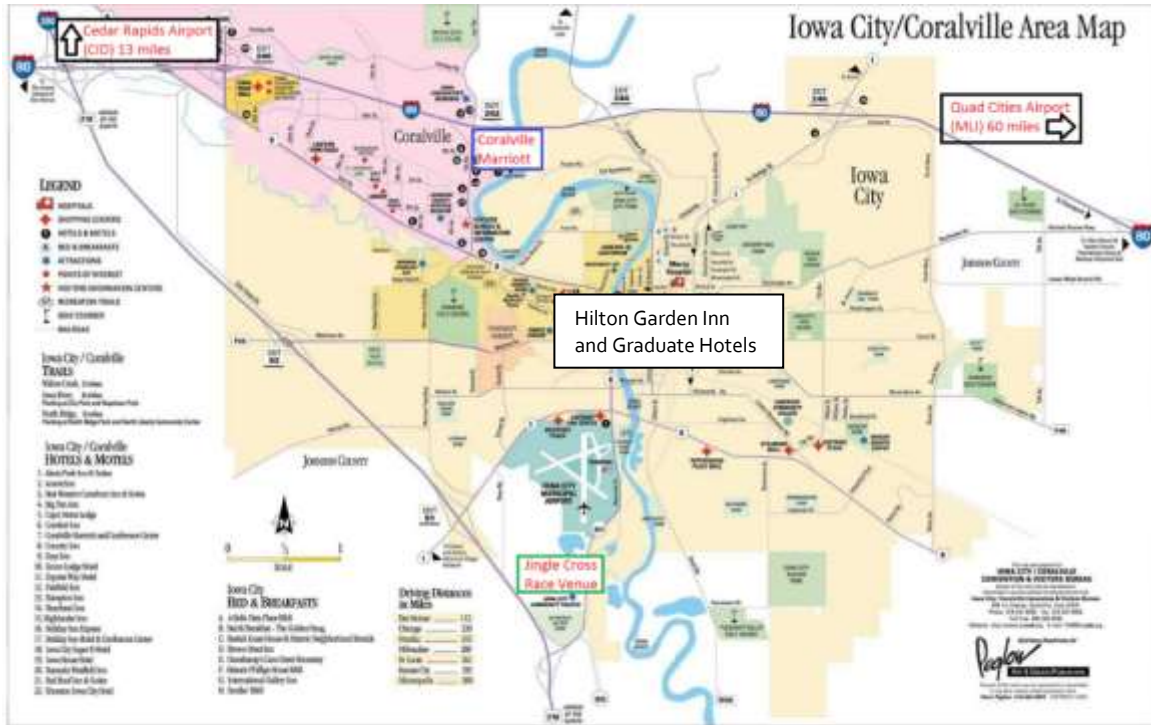
DIRECTIONS TO RACE VENUE FROM I-80 (SEE MAP ON NEXT PAGE)

Directions from Graduate and Hilton Garden Inn to the Johnson County Fairgrounds: Exit the parking deck and head south just a few feet to Burlington Street. Take a right onto Burlington Street and travel about 1/4 mile to Riverside. Take a left onto Riverside, travel about 3 miles. The fairgrounds will be on your right about 1 mile past the Iowa City Municipal Airport.

PARKING AND TRANSPORTATION

IOWA BIKE COALITION BIKE VALET

We encourage people to ride their bikes to our venue. We have a complimentary Bike Valet provided by Iowa Bicycle Coalition all weekend. Riverside drive will have an ordinance change on World Cup Saturday so there is reduced traffic speed and a one lane shut down for bicycles.

GRINCH GREEN ZONE

PRO TEAM RESERVED PARKING - RESERVATIONS REQUIRED ALL 3 DAYS

Pro teams are required to reserve space for parking in the pro team zone by Monday, September 24th at 8:00 PM CST. Reservations must be made on-line at jinglecross.com: follow MENU>Bike Riders>Team Parking>Pro Team Parking Number and size of all tents and vehicles must be declared and the intended footprint (example: 20x30, 20x40, etc).

**** A Handicap Parking area will also be designated within the P3 Green Zone ******

MEDICAL TEAM, USAC, AND UCI PARKING

Enter through the Green Zone Parking Lot. Park on the Grass South of the Green Parking Zone.

AMATEUR TEAM TENT VILLAGES AND PARKING ZONES: PASSES REQUIRED ALL 3 DAYS

NORTH POLE BLUE ZONE

INCLUDES 10X10 TENT SPACE AND CAR SPACE: Tent near, base of Mt. Krumpit Face, car space near start line

SANTA CROSS RED ZONE

INCLUDES 10X10 TENTS SPACE AND CAR SPACE: Near registration and central. Your 10x10 ft space and vehicle are next to each other. This is our most popular location and reservations always run out first.

SOUTH POLE WHITE ZONE

INCLUDES 10X10 TENT SPACE AND CAR SPACE

This is within Whoville zone with food and beverages and the Jingle Cross finish line nearby. Both your vehicle and tent space are near each other.

The tent space is the infield area on the South Field near the Pit (West Side of the Jingle Cross Finishing straight). The car space is in the White Parking Zone.

RACE GOVERNANCE
RACE CLASSIFICATION/PERMIT

The 2018 UCI Jingle Cross is classified as a UCI C2 level event on Friday, September 28th and C1 for Sunday, September 30th. The Telenet UCI Cyclo-cross World Cup Jingle Cross Iowa City is the second World Cup event of a 9 race series for



the 2018-2019 season. All UCI Elite Men and UCI Elite Women races will be run under UCI regulations. The UCI scale of penalties is solely applicable. A current UCI International racing license is required to race the UCI races.

The Jingle Cross is also classified as a USAC Category A level event, held under permit number 2018-xxxx. Non-UCI races will be held under USA Cycling regulations.

COURSE DISTANCE

The course loop distances have been measured for the current published maps as follows

Friday: 3.15 km

Saturday: 3.17 km

Sunday: 3.17 km

RACE REGISTRATION

The direct link for online registration for both UCI Elite races and USAC amateur races on our Registration Page at www.JingleCross.com. This will directly link you to our BikeReg site at www.bikereg.com. On-line Registration closes at 8:00 pm CST Tuesday evening, September 25th at 8:00 PM CST. USAC Race day registration is permitted at the Johnson County Fairgrounds for USAC races only and a late fee of \$10 will be applied. Late registration will open from noon – 6 pm on Thursday September 27th, 11:00 am on Friday, 7:00 AM on Saturday, and 7:00 AM on Sunday. Registration closes 60 minutes before each USAC event (except gravel grinder which closes 30 minutes before. USAC Race Day registration is permitted but UCI registration MUST be done on-line BEFORE on-line registration closes on 9-25-2018. Rider confirmation and race number pick-up closes 1 hour before start of the UCI races. There are no refunds of any registrations for any reasons.

FIELD AND CATEGORY LIMITS

Total riders on course at any time will be capped at 400 riders. Total riders per category is 120 except for beginner category 5 riders with a maximum of 75 riders per wave.

STAGING OF RIDERS: USACYCLING EVENTS

All USAC races will have riders staged by the following system:

Friday, September 28th

1. Pre-registered ranked riders: Online ranking system Crossresults.com
2. Pre-registered unranked riders: order of registration
3. Foreign riders randomized between all entrants in steps 1-2
4. Late/Race day registration riders in order of registration

Saturday, September 29th

1. Top 8 riders from Friday
2. EXCEPTION: Cat 4 and 5 men will be called in groups of 8 from each age bracket, youngest first using cross results.com
3. Pre-registered ranked riders: Online ranking system Crossresults.com
4. Pre-registered unranked riders: order of registration
5. Foreign riders randomized between all entrants in steps 1-2
6. Late/Race day registration riders in order of registration

Sunday, September 30th

7. Top 8 riders from Saturday
8. Pre-registered ranked riders: Online ranking system Crossresults.com
9. Pre-registered unranked riders: order of registration
10. Foreign riders randomized between all entrants in steps 1-2
11. Late/Race day registration riders in order of registration

There are several USAC categories that will be racing at one time during a specific start time. Each wave of categories will be staged separately and started separately. The general time gap between waves of categories will be about 30 seconds. Some smaller number categories may be combined into one wave at the discretion of the officials. If this occurs, each category within that wave will still be scored separately.

STAGING OF RIDERS: UCI

Standard UCI protocols will be used in the staging of riders for the UCI Elite Men/Women races. The start lists for these races will be provided in order of staging, with in order of UCI points followed by computer randomization for riders with no points. Riders will be allowed to line up individually as their names or numbers are called. Riders are required to report to the staging area 15 minutes prior to the start of their race.

STARTING PROCEDURE

Race Starts (both USAC and UCI): Standard UCI protocol will be followed, with the Chief Referee responsible for starting the race. The start will be as follows: A notice will be given at one minute to start and 30 seconds to start. The start signal (gunshot or whistle) may be given at any point after this last warning. Start Lights will be used for the World Cup. Other races will commence in waves at 30-second to 1 minute intervals (referees discretion). All riders will finish on the leader's lap but may be finishing on an earlier lap than the leader if they have been lapped or are nearly lapped. Listen for Officials instructions at the start. **NO RIDERS WILL BE PULLED FROM USAC RACES.**

PIT AREA

The great guys at Shimano will be offering Neutral Support for all riders and races regardless of category. No spectators or family members are allowed in the pit. Absolutely no media personnel or photographers are allowed in the pit. For safety reasons, all mechanics in the pit must be there for support reasons only, not for photography.



UCI PIT PASS

Each UCI rider is allowed two mechanics in the pit area. All UCI mechanics are required to wear their pit pass bracelet and keep visible to race officials at all times. Pit passes are distributed at registration. No pass, no access to the pit. We have a green bracelet Pit Pass for the UCI C1 and C2 events that is different than the Pit Pass for the World Cup. The World Cup Pit passes are blue for the men and red for the women's events.

PIT PASS: USACYCLING EVENTS

Each USAC rider is allowed one mechanic in the pit. No pit pass or mechanics license is required

FEEDING

Per the UCI regulation, Feeding and hand-ups are not permitted. No exceptions.

LAPPED RIDERS

For UCI Elite events, lapped riders will be pulled according to UCI regulations. Lapped riders will be pulled in accordance with a time percentage (80%) slower than the lead rider. This is to ensure the safety of the lead riders and also ensure that lapped riders do not inadvertently affect the race outcome by hindering either the lead rider or those in pursuit. Riders that are pulled MUST leave the course when and where instructed to do so.

For USAC events, officials will NOT pull lapped riders. Slower riders MUST give way to riders overtaking them. If safety or obstructive issues arise because a lapped rider fails to give way, the lapped rider may be pulled at the discretion of the Chief Referee if they represent a hazard or repeatedly or purposefully impede lapping riders.

PIT BIKE WASH

The Bike Wash in the Shimano Pit Area will be available ONLY to mechanics in the pit area for current racers. Riders/mechanics may NOT use the pit bike wash before or after their event, only DURING their event.

PRO TEAM AREA BIKE WASH

The pro team area bike wash is on the western side of the pro team parking area just south of Anti-Doping. This area is for Pro Teams Only and Sponsored by Finish Line USA.

FINISH LINE USA BIKE WASH

This wash area is in the infield near North West corner of Building C (registration building) and sponsored by Finish Line USA. Please try their amazing products as you clean and lube your bike for your next event.

HOTEL BIKE WASH

Some of our host hotels may set up hoses near the hotel grounds. Please do not take wet or dirty bikes into any of our host hotels.

SHOWERS

Bikes To You Showers will be located in the Northwest corner of the Pro Team (Green) parking area all weekend

Please hose off at the bike wash sites before you shower in building C. Do not use the showers as your hose down area. Please hose yourself down at the bike wash before you enter the showers.

RESULTS

Results will be posted at registration and compiled by One2 Go Event Services. All results will be considered final unless a protest is received by the Chief Judge within 15 minutes of posting. Online results will be posted as soon as possible. Preregistered riders will get results emailed from One2Go if your email address is included with your pre-registration. Press releases will be emailed for local, national, and international media in the UCI races.

ANTI-DOPING

The organizers and staff of the Jingle Cross are strong advocates for the missions of the USADA and WADA. All USAC and UCI riders regardless of category are subject to UCI/USADA Anti-Doping Examination Regulations and all competitors and team personnel must abide by these regulations. Any riders with a non-negative test result (following any adjudication process) will forfeit any prizes won at Jingle Cross. Jingle Cross, Inc., USAC, and the UCI officials have no role in the USADA and WADA directives. Therefore, riders must check at the Anti-doping location ON THEIR OWN to see if they have been selected for testing. Testing will be inside the Fairgrounds Administration building adjacent to the START line (see map). REGARDLESS OF YOUR PLACE OR YOUR EVENT, IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE RIDER TO CHECK WITH DOPING CONTROL FOLLOWING THEIR RACE. The list of riders required to report for doping control will be posted PRIOR to the finish of each race. All USAC and UCI riders must follow UCI procedures for doping

control. Any rider selected for testing but who fails to present themselves for testing could be considered a positive result. These regulations are entirely handled by the USADA and/or WADA and Jingle Cross, Inc. has no jurisdiction or say in this matter.

GREEN ROOM AND FLASH INTERVIEW AREA

A green room for the UCI Pro riders will be provided directly behind the podium for the World Cup. Top 3 athletes from both the men's and women's UCI events should go to this Green Room immediately for changing and then report to the podium within 5 minutes after crossing the finish line. Towels and water will be provided. UCI riders shall remain in the podium area briefly after the ceremony for interviews. Riders should then report to the press conference and doping control as required.

RACE FINISH / AWARDS PROTOCOL

THERE ARE TWO PODIUMS AT THIS EVENT;

1. The Telenet UCI Cyclo-cross World Cup Podium: North of Building C, used solely for World Cup races only.
2. The Jingle Cross Podium: South Pole Infield, used for all races both USAC all weekend and UCI events on Friday and Sunday.

The top 3 riders from UCI races on Friday and Sunday are required to report to the Jingle Cross Podium immediately after crossing the line for a photo opportunity and podium ceremony. This podium presentation is based on unofficial results, and a repeat of the podium presentation may be required if official results determine a different outcome after the protest period. For USAC categories, TOP 3 Overall winners from the point's competition must present themselves at the podium following their finish on Sunday, September 30th. Please wear team gear for the overall podium. **DO NOT EXPECT TO INCLUDE YOUR BIKE ON THE PODIUM FOR PHOTOS.** It is disrespectful to other teams and will not be tolerated.

U₂₃ PODIUM FOR JINGLE CROSS

A U₂₃ Podium for both the men's and women's UCI C1 and C2 races will be held for recognition and photo purposes only. There are no awards delivered during the c1 and c2 podium. There will be U₂₃ podium for the Telenet UCI World Cup Women but there will not be one for the men.

Proper Tax forms will be required for UCI racers and MUST be filled out at registration. Foreign riders must complete the IRS Form W88 before picking up prizes. NO prizes will be paid without these. All payments will be paid by check only, no cash will be distributed under any circumstances. The Belgian and Netherlands riders will have their funds wired to their respective federations as a lump sum. NO CASH PAYOUTS. DO NOT ASK.
